## National History Day 2022 "Debate and Diplomacy in History: Successes, Consequences, Failures"

## Guidelines

**Topic:** Students should choose a topic which interests them and can be related to the overall theme. The topic should involve people, events, advancements, or issues from at least 25 years ago.

**Project Possibilities:** Students can choose one of the following categories in which to present the results of their research:

- 1. Paper (Individual)
- 2. Exhibit (Individual)
- 3. Exhibit (Group-2 or 3 students)
- 4. Performance (Individual)
- 5. Performance (Group—2-5 students)
- 6. Documentary (Individual)
- 7. Documentary (Group-2 or 3 students)
- 8. Web Site (Individual)
- 9. Web Site (Group-2 or 3 students)

There are specific requirements for each of these categories that we will discuss in class.

**Requirements for Sources:** Students will need a wide range of sources for their research. The sources should be **both primary and secondary sources**, and include **at least one book**.

An **annotated bibliography** is **required** for all projects. We will be discussing primary and secondary sources and the annotated bibliography in class.

The minimum requirements for sources are as follows:

Total sources: 6

At least 1 source must be non-Internet. At least 1 source must be primary.

For a **quality project** that might be eligible for District History Day competition, students should consider these **requirements**:

Total sources: 12

At least 3 sources should be non-Internet. At least 5 sources should be primary.
