Personal Connection:

My National History Day project is about two people, Harry and Bertha Holt, who changed many children's lives in the 1950's by giving them a family through international adoption. The Holts adopted eight Korean War orphans in 1955, even though they already had six biological children of their own. They also helped other families find children through international adoption. I chose this topic because I have a strong connection with it. My brother and I were both adopted through the Holt International Children's Services, and my adoptive mom and brother even got to meet Bertha Holt.
